NN's YEAR IN REVIEW IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR us to share the who, what, when, why, and how of our activities and accomplishments over the past 12 months. In preparing this year's publication, we realized: this is actually not about sharing who we are as an organization; it's about sharing who you are.

Though much has changed in the five-plus years since our founding, we have always and steadfastly been about meeting and adapting to the needs of our community. This year, as we continued to move further away from the acute phase of the pandemic, our membership grew by nearly 30 percent, we resumed much-needed services to our 55+ community, new programs emerged, existing programs were enlivened, and we continued to share and build upon stories and connections.

We are Northampton Neighbors. And in all that we do, we are you.

We are ... MEMBERS

NN is 1,533 members strong and growing. We receive and volunteer services each month, from errands to rides to small repairs to technical assistance and so much more. We come together for speakers on subjects of interest, guided conversations on topics of members' own choosing, mixing and mingling, hiking and biking, book discussions, conversational Spanish, gardening stories, and just because.

We are ... DONORS

NN received donations from 495 people last year, including 51 sustaining donors committed to monthly or yearly contributions to the organization. In addition to members, our donors are friends of members who give in honor of someone or something, local residents, and businesses giving in ways large and small. All have the same goal of enriching and making possible the work of Northampton Neighbors.

We are ... VOLUNTEERS

There are many ways to volunteer, and at NN we welcome them all: providing direct services to members, serving on the board or committees, helping with events, and more. This year we expanded our board by six to a total of 15 members overseeing the organization, from community partnerships and development to communications and the DoozyDo Parade working group. NN's volunteers are creative, committed, and all about connecting to the organization in ways that are meaningful to each of us.

We are ... COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Northampton Neighbors actively partners with local organizations to expand our offerings, from talks and classes to activities such as walking, kayaking, skiing, and participating with or volunteering time with the organizations directly. Our less formal partnerships include outreach to inform our Monthly Insights education series on local, relevant resources and other collaborations. "It takes a village" is certainly true here, and we are grateful for the relationships we have created and continue to cultivate in the community.

We are . . . BUSY!

Our work includes: fielding and matching service requests with volunteers; a Laptop Program; collaborations with Forbes Library and Grow Food Northampton, UMass, Pioneer Valley Memory Care Initiative with Cooley Dickinson Hospital, and others; welcome visits with new members; a bimonthly newsletter and website maintenance; supporting Neighborhood Circles and Interest Groups; inviting speakers and others to share expertise; the NN listserve; volunteer training; birthday cards and other outreach including social gatherings and regular phone check-ins; contributing to the *Conz Street Chronicle*; and so much more!

Volunteering

At the heart of all we do are those who volunteer in a variety of ways to help our members continue to lead rich, engaged lives. Our most visible volunteers are those who provide direct services such as tech support, small home repairs and chores, a ride to the doctor, or a helping hand with groceries. We believe that connecting those who are able to help with those who need it benefits both, as well as the greater community. Many members note the joy in giving as well as receiving, and participate across the board. In addition, we encourage participation on committees and helping to plan events such as our DoozyDo Parade and annual summer gathering, as well as leading Neighborhood Circles and Interest Groups. 
